



SMEs play a significant role




58% of total turnover = €14.000 billion/a






SMEs provide employment

1) Information, Feedback, Specialised advice, Business Support, Internationalisation:

- Support the full exploitation of the opportunities of the Internal Market
- Support to SMEs <u>in expanding to new markets</u> For instance by providing help in identifying <u>potential commercial partners for</u> <u>companies</u> (EU + international dimension where applicable)
- <u>Advise to companies on EU legislation and policies</u>, as well as on more <u>specific</u> <u>issues</u> such as <u>access to finance and frontline</u> <u>assistance on IPR</u>.
- <u>SME feedback. Listening to enterprises</u>. SMEs as the sounding board to receive the views and feedback of SMEs on EU laws, initiatives and policies





2) Innovation, Transnational Technology Transfer

<u>Innovation through Technology & Knowledge Transfer Services & exploitation of</u> <u>R&D results</u>

- Technology Transfer between companies operating in different countries
- Transfer of knowledge (other than technology) between companies active in different countries

• Transnational exploitation of research results proceeding from national, European, or International organisations active in research e.g.: (CERN, ESA, EUREKA, JRC)





3) Support for the participation of SMEs Horizon 2020

Promote general awareness on among SMEs about Horizon 2020 opportunities

Provide information on forthcoming calls

Ease the setting up of international consortia for the participation of SMEs to Horizon 2020 calls for proposals.

<u>Advice</u>

E.g.: advice on preparation and drafting of proposals and or project management, project coordination, signposting to specialised consultants

<u>Support to SME Instrument implementation: Key account management</u> (Support on Project interactions with the EC. Address possible GAPs between the company's profile and project characteristics. Identify right project coaching.

Tools & events to used to deliver international business, innovation and research support services

1) DATABASE. The MERLIN Database contains on average 12.000 active profiles.

Profiles can cover: <u>business cooperation</u> (aimed at finding international partners for commercial purposes or <u>innovation</u> (aimed at finding international partners willing to access a technology: "technology request" or partners willing to make a technology available: "technology offer".

Demands & Requests are matched automatically by exploiting key words (AMT) or manually by EEN partners, when the AMT does not deliver adequate results.

2) EVENTS (Company Missions or Brokerage Events aimed at bringing entrepreneurs to meet and discuss business tech. transfer opportunities personally)





Financial Instruments for SMEs CIP (2007-2014)

Commission

CIP Financial Instruments: the 2007-13 <u>Competitiveness</u> and <u>Innovation framework Programme (CIP)</u> had a budget of €1.1 bn to facilitate access to loans and equity finance for SMEs where market gaps have been identified.

Each euro spent has leveraged an average € 5.4 on risk capital (under the High growth and innovative SME facility - GIF) or € 35 on bank loans (under the SME guarantee facility - SMEG), which means it generated some € 19.9bn in new finance for SMEs from financial institutions and benefited more than 328 000 SMEs



Financial Instruments for SMEs

> Loan Guarantee Facility (COSME)

- yuarantees for loans to SMEs up to € 150 000*
- securitisation of SME debt finance portfolios

Equity Facility for Growth for SMEs (COSME)

- focus: growth stage
- final beneficiaries: growth-oriented SMEs
- > also covering early stage investments
- Through Financial Intermediaries
- ♣ 1,3 bio € budget for 2014 2020

Cluster firms ...


- are more innovative than non-cluster firms
